About Us

Fort Bend County officially formed a Public Transportation Department in June 2005. We are a general public transportation provider operating Demand Response and Commuter Park and Ride.

In 2022, Fort Bend Transit provided more than 228,000 trips and registered more than 2,000 new clients.

We receive funding through the Federal Transit Administration (FTA), the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT), and partnerships with organizations such as the Cities of Rosenberg, Richmond, and Sugar Land.

Fort Bend County is pleased to offer Commuter Bus service that provides weekday service from Fort Bend County. Service may begin as early as 4:30 AM and end as late as 9:00 PM. There is no weekend service.

Demand Response Service

Fort Bend County also offers a shared-ride bus service which is available for use by the general public for trips within Fort Bend County. You can schedule a ride for the first "destination" drop-off as early as 8:00 AM and last pick-up for no later than 5:00 PM. Reservations can be made 30 days or up to 1 business day in advance of the appointment time. The cost is a low fare of \$1.00 each way. Service is available Monday through Friday, while not operating on county holidays.
